Kicking off with our Habitat Film Festival - The Best of Pan Indian Cinema. The Festival brings to you the award winning and critically acclaimed films of 2023-24 followed by interactions with the film makers, as well as workshops on screenwriting and production. In addition to the Festival, there are other great documentaries later in the month including a package of wildlife films that span subjects ranging from biodiversity in the desert, to sea turtles, fiddler crabs and Kasturi, the iconic musk deer. The presence for Q & A's post screening of people from the teams that produced these short films will provide further insights.

Book launches and discussions score highly this month.

Anurag Maloo along with his Polish rescuers will share details on the miraculous rescue, a year back, from a deep crevasse on Mt. Annapurna, in a talk Inside Annapurna. It promises to be a thrilling account of the heroic rescue and the miraculous revival by doctors who battled to save him.

We are looking forward to having Tathagata Bhattacharya, only child of cult Bengali writer Nabarun Bhattacharya and only grandchild of Bijon Bhattacharya and writer activist Mahasweta Devi, to discuss his first novel General Firebrand and His Red Atlas.

Delhi is centre stage with book discussions with Madhulika Liddle on her book Delhi: A History in Literature and Firestorm in Paradise by Rana Safvi, a fictional love story set during the days leading up to the 1857 Uprising.

Adding to the Delhi experience is a curated concert Mehfil: the Delhi Poets by Vidya Shah with Chandrashekhar Tampi that showcases the evolution of Urdu language poetry and its relationship to Delhi through poetry and music.

A Panel Discussion on Driving Engines of India-US Relations after the Elections in India & USA, with a panel of eminent, informed and experienced discussants is an important talk this month

The Nashist series returns after a gap following the sad demise of K.K. Kohli. The show that he helmed over the years goes on with an evening of poetry and music based on the works of renowned Punjabi writer and poet Shiv Kumar Batalvi.

We are excited to be back with the IHC Book Club in its new avatar-Suitably Booked - that was announced on social media on World Book Day on April 23rd. The new Hybrid Book Club allows you to join in from wherever you are on a zoom link. We kick off with an in-person conversation between author Nilanjana Roy on her novel 'Black River' and journalist & writer Jai Arjun Singh that will also be live-streamed.






